If you've always wanted to work in the sports industry, but don't possess the talents of Wayne Gretzky or Mike Weir, check out the many behind-the-scenes sports jobs posted on the new Web site www.canadiansportsjobs.com.

This site, the first of its kind in Canada, was established on June 1, 2004, by Cosmos Sports and has already received more than 1,000,000 hits.

Founder and Cosmos Sports president Cary Kaplan says the site fills a gap that previously existed between sports employers and sports enthusiasts who wanted to work in the field and that it will make it easier for job seekers to find available opportunities targeted to their interests.

Cosmos has also successfully hosted two Sports Career Conferences, with the next one scheduled for October 15 and 16, 2004. (Past conferences have

included speakers from Maple Leaf Sports & Entertainment, Toronto Blue Jays and the CFL.)

A variety of opportunities are currently available on the site's listings, from sports reporter to television traffic co-ordinator to ticket agent.

Other features of the new Web site include online career advice and space to store an online résumé.

You can search for jobs by categories such as hockey, baseball, golf, even cheerleading, or look at all opportunities in specific provinces or cities.

Registration is free, but is required before you can browse the posted jobs.
